

My dear sisters and brothers,

Deaneries and Deans

Last week, I had to cancel Tuesday's Mass while I attended a Training Day for Deans. This raised some questions, such as "What is a Dean?"

The Archdiocese is made up of 141 parishes. Each parish is grouped with a number of other parishes. These groups of parishes are called Deaneries. So the parishes in Warrington make up the Warrington Deanery. Last December, Warrington Deanery was extended to include Widnes as well. So we are now part of the Warrington and Widnes Deanery.

Each Deanery is led by a Dean. A Dean is a priest appointed by the Archbishop to act in his name. Broadly, the role of the Dean is two-fold: to support and care for the clergy of the Deanery, and to nurture and guide collaboration between the parishes.

Canon Christopher was the Dean of Warrington for many years until he stepped down just before the beginning of the pandemic in 2020. The Archbishop then asked me to take over as Dean.

The Deaneries of Warrington and Widnes were joined together last year to enable the implementation of the Synodal Pastoral Plan published on the First Sunday of Advent. The Deans are undergoing training at present because they are needed to facilitate the implementation of the Pastoral Plan in each Deanery during the coming years.

At last week's training, we were considering how best to implement Synodal Pastoral Councils in each Deanery and how 'Families of Parishes' might work. There were updates on how the new Deaneries were beginning to work across the Archdiocese and the rollout of a new initiative to better support priests as we become older and fewer in number. It was a good day and very helpful to hear how different areas are approaching the new Synodal way of working together.

Covid-19 Update

Professor Tim Spector, lead scientist on the ZOE COVID Study app, comments on the latest data:

"It feels like COVID Déjà Vu as the situation looks much like it did just a month ago. We hope that cases continue to fall consistently so that case numbers finally return to an acceptable level. Until then, cases remain historically high with one in 25 people currently having COVID and numbers still increasing in Scotland and Northern Ireland. It will be interesting to see what the Prime Minister's "Living with COVID" announcement will include. Whilst I agree we have to learn to live with COVID, and hospital and ICU admissions are very low, the ZOE data doesn't yet suggest that we've entered a stable or endemic phase. It's very likely that there are more variants on the horizon with unpredictable properties. When the mandates are lifted, to protect others, my advice is we should all still be self-isolating for five days from first new symptoms, when infectiousness is high, and tell others to do the same. For individual protection, wearing a high quality FFP2 or FFP3 mask is your best way to reduce risk."


