- 4 St Benedict died surrounded by his brothers with his hands lifted in prayer.
Let us pray for all those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith,
especially those who prayed in this church and served this community.

- 5 For our own personal intentions; for Kathleen Hough, Mgr Anthony Dennick
and Fr Dermott Donnelly who have died;
and for those we are remembering this weekend,
especially Margaret Hibbert, a Private Intention, Penny Carroll,
the young people celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation this weekend,
and all the people of this parish community.
