My dear sisters and brothers,

#### Compassion

This Sunday's Gospel is the story of Jesus healing ten people who were suffering with leprosy. Leprosy is an incredibly infectious disease so, in the time of Jesus, people who contracted the disease were forced to live apart from the community. It was necessary, but harsh. How did they survive? How did they get food, medical help, company? It's no wonder Jesus felt immediate compassion for those who approached him.

In contrast, I was shocked by the lack of compassion at this week's party-political conference. It makes me wonder: Do MPs realise that most people don't want to have to claim universal credit but are forced to do so because of their circumstances? Do they realise the humiliation people with disabilities are forced to go through in order to claim extra support? Do they realise the horror the majority have experienced who come to our shores seeking asylum? The rhetoric used by some MPs this week was devoid of any compassion or understanding of the realities so many people face.

The people pilloried in speeches this week are not in a dissimilar situation to those who came to Jesus in today's Gospel. They deserve so much better.

# Covid-19 Update

Unfortunately, Covid-19 is on the rise again. There are about 220,000 cases a day which equates to 1 in every 26 people (R being 1:1). At the same time, the common cold is back. The symptoms for both Covid and colds are very similar. The only reliable way of finding out which you have is by taking a lateral flow test.

#### **Installation of Canons**

The installation of new Canons will take place in the Cathedral during the 12.15 pm Mass on Tuesday 8 November. We've booked a coach which will leave St Oswald's at 11.00 am and St Benedict's at 11.10 am. #### Deanery Synodal Council (DSC)

Each deanery has now set up a Synodal Council as part of implementing the Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan which was the fruit of Synod 2020. Our DSC first met in July. We have our second meeting in Widnes next Saturday morning. Please pray for the DSC – that we learn to listen to each other and to our guide, the Holy Spirit.

# Prisoners' Sunday

Finally, today is the annual Day of Prayer for Prisoners and their Dependents. Those in prison, their families and those with previous convictions often find themselves on the margins of society due to the social stigma associated with imprisonment.
