My dear sisters and brothers,

On Friday, the priests of the Archdiocese gathered with the Archbishop for Mass and lunch at St Margaret Clitherow Centre (formerly known as LACE). It was an opportunity to celebrate with the priests who are marking significant anniversaries of their ordination this year. In our own deanery, two of the priests in Widnes are celebrating jubilees – Fr Mark Moran (Silver Jubilee) and Bishop John Rawsthorne (Diamond Jubilee).

I remember attending a similar gathering at Upholland just after my own ordination in 1989. Then, there were about 325 priests in the Archdiocese. Now, in 2022, there are just over a hundred. In this month's Catholic Pictorial, the Archbishop writes that in twenty years' time the number of active priests will be about 50!

Recently, I was interviewed about the declining number of priests as well as the dwindling number of people who come regularly to Sunday Mass. I said I think it's part of the ebb and flow of Church life over the centuries. Fr John McLoughlin describes it as the tide going out, but it'll come back. What's the cause? To a large extent, I think it's down to secularisation. When society, and the families which make up that society, no longer see the need for Church or religion, or have a very individualistic idea of faith, then inevitably there will be less vocations and smaller congregations.

The situation in which we find ourselves is not hopeless and we shouldn't let it get us down. We simply need to regroup, as it were, and continue to serve God and his people as best we can. The Deanery Synodal Council will help us to do this in the coming

years. As I've often said, it's the Lord's Church. He's kept it going for the last two thousand years and he'll continue to keep it going. We just have to learn to listen to him and allow his Spirit to guide us.
