especially the people who have asked us to pray for them
and those we have heard about in the news or from others.

and for those we are remembering this weekend,
especially Norman Johnson, Joan Howl
and all the people of this parish community.

- 6 Now let us ask Mary, the mother of Jesus, to pray for us all:
"Hail Mary..."
