My dear sisters and brothers,

Holy Week

Today marks the beginning of the holiest week of the year for Christians. We remember and celebrate what Jesus did out of love for us - how he suffered, died, and rose to new life.

Palm Sunday

On this first day of Holy Week, we recall Jesus' entry into the city of Jerusalem. The people welcomed Jesus by waving palm leaves and singing 'Hosanna!' We too hold palms and sing 'Hosanna' as we go with Jesus into Holy Week.

Holy Thursday

On Holy Thursday evening, we recall the way Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and shared the Last After Mass, we stay for a short while 'watching' with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Good Friday

All over the world at 3.00 pm on Good Friday, Christians stop whatever they are doing (if they can) to celebrate the Passion of the Lord. In a simple but ancient liturgy, we listen to St John's account of the Passion of the Lord, pray for the needs of the world, and venerate the Cross.

Holy Saturday & Easter Sunday

Finally, on Holy Saturday night – the holiest night of the year for Christians - we keep the 'mother of all vigils' (St Augustine). The big Easter candle will be lit. In the light of that candle, we will listen to the stories of what God has done for his people through the ages. Then we will renew our baptismal promises, welcome new members into the Church, and celebrate Christ's risen presence with us in the eucharist. This great celebration continues at Mass on Easter Sunday.

You will find the details of the various liturgies on the reverse side of this sheet.

If you will be celebrating Holy Week at home this year, I will be posting liturgies you can use on the Parish website. I've also posted these prayer sheets to those on the mailing list.

Chrism Mass

Many thanks to all those who've signed up to come to the Chrism Mass on Wednesday. The coach will depart promptly from St Oswald's at 6.10 pm and St Benedict's at 6.20 pm. We hope to be back in Warrington by 10.00 pm. If you're able to contribute towards the cost of the coach, I suggest £5 per adult.

Communion under both kinds

On Holy Thursday, we will reintroduce communion under both kinds to allow parishioners the choice of receiving from the chalice in addition to the host. Given the sensitivities following the pandemic, we will do this carefully and gradually. Reservations about receiving communion from the chalice come from a fear of possibly catching germs. Professional, peer-reviewed medical research from epidemiologists has concluded that there is no known outbreak of disease directly related to this liturgical practice. However, common sense would suggest that individuals who have a cold or other spreadable symptoms should refrain from receiving from the chalice.
